Rainbow Services: Rainbow Services are proud to announce the opening of Harlow's new Community Hub, available to all Harlow residents and runs until April 2022. Please see the flyer for how to contact the Community Hub in person or via the telephone and social media. They offer a range of services for residents affected by crisis situations, as well as information on community and social activities, access to volunteering and regular workshops.

Community Embrace: Community Embrace works within Harlow helping and supporting the local community. Their aim is to promote diversity, advance cohesion, and encourage dialogues by connecting communities. They do this by bringing people of diverse backgrounds together through food and culture. Through the gatherings and activities that they put together they tackle food poverty, reduce loneliness, encourage social inclusion, and support people's mental health. This month they have launched the Harlow Pantry and well-being hub. Based at The GPCA Playbarn in Staple Tye (CM18 6YJ), the Pantry is open to all local residents and has an Annual Membership Scheme of £5 a year per each adult within a household and £2.50 for each weekly visit. The first session will be on Saturday 11th December between 2.30pm and 4pm.
