Illness: If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please ensure you advise the school office by leaving a message on the absence line. Please remember to leave their name, class and **details of their symptoms**. If your child has a sickness bug (vomiting/diarrhoea), please ensure they have a period of 48hrs without an episode before sending them back to school.

COVID-19: On Monday 21 February, the Prime Minister set out the next phase of the government's COVID-19 response 'Living with COVID-19'. COVID-19 continues to be a virus that we learn to live with and the imperative to reduce the disruption to children and young people's education remains.

Vaccination of 5-11 year olds - The JCVI have announced that all children aged 5-11 years old will be eligible for two low doses of the vaccine 12 weeks apart.
