### **Secondary Admission for September 2023:**

Applications for secondary places opened on Monday 12th September. This is for parents of current Year 6 children to apply for a secondary school (Year 7) place for September 2023. Applications can be made at <a href="https://www.essex.gov.uk/admissions">www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</a> and close on 31st October 2022.

Free School Meals: Automatic entitlement to a free school meal finishes at the end of Year 2 and only children from low income families are eligible from Year 3. If your household income is less than £16,190 per year, or you receive Income Support or an equivalent benefit, you will need to make an application if you want your child to receive a free school meal from September.
