We will be exploring the cause and effect of both World Wars. We will look how they brought communities together and how communities worked to support each other and keep morale up. We will explore War poetry and songs as well as the communication with loved ones both at home and abroad.

We will be looking at skills in art of creating mixed media art, mixing and gradating colours, understanding historical timelines, knowing what resources are reliable and in Computing we will be studying coding.

Key Vocabulary

Allies- cooperating with another for a military or other purpose

Evacuation-the action of evacuating a person or a place

Blitz-From the word Blitzkrieg meaning lightning. Refers to a time where the German airforce bombed London.

Rationing-allow someone to have only (a fixed amount of a commodity)

Propaganda-information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or point of view

Trenches-a long, narrow ditch

Armistice-an agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time; a truce

Truce-an agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time

During this topic, we look at how we all need to work together to achieve Peace in our World. In this way we live our lives in the way that God wants us to. Loving our families and coming together as communities to build up the Kingdom of God.

We will be linking the learning to our school values and identifying why each of these are important in their own unique way when aspiring to achieve Peace.

We will also look at how communities came together to support each other with the supporting those who lost their homes in the Blitz to being able to feed each other during strict rationing.
