Writing	Write a diary entry of a child living in the Stone Age. What did you do? Where did you go?	Make an advertisement for selling a new Stone Age tool – How does it work? How is it made? How will it help the person in their daily life?	Create an acrostic poem using the word 'Stone Age'.
Research	Find out about Skara Brae - Write a few paragraphs to describe this place. Use interesting adjectives and ambitious words.	Research how the people in the Stone Age made music? Make a model of a 'Stone Age 'instrument. Is it a percussion instrument, wind instrument or a stringed instrument? What would it have been made of?	Make up a quiz with facts about The Stone Age. Make sure you also have the answers!
Creative	Stone Age people could not pop to the shop for food. Everything they ate had to be caught or collected. Write your own recipe for a stone age dinner using ingredients that would have been available to them.	Design and make a cave or a stone age house.	Draw and label a woolly mammoth or Sabre Tooth Cat.
