This half term, we will be learning about World War 2 and how it brought about Peace for the communities around the World. Each week you should try to choose at least one activity to complete. The activities suggested below will last for this half term - tick them off as you complete them. You can choose any activity you like - they do not have to be done in a particular order. Be as creative as you like with your learning. Not all activities will need to be covered.

Your child will still need to complete Maths Abacus/Active Learn activities on line each week, plus continue learning their weekly spellings and read daily.

Writing	<p><u>News report</u> Write a newspaper report about the outbreak of WW2. Include quotes from world leaders.</p>	<p><u>Diary</u> Write a diary entry as an evacuee of WW2. Explain what it was like travelling to an unknown place in the countryside and staying with strangers.</p>	<p><u>Letter</u> Imagine you are applying for a job as a soldier. Write a letter explaining why you would be an excellent candidate for the job.</p>
Research	<p><u>Research</u> Research one of the countries involved in World War 2. What was their involvement in the war? Who was their leader at the time? How many lives were lost? How has the country changed since the war?</p>	<p><u>The Blitz!</u> Find out about the Blitz. Create a poster or information sheet about what happened.</p>	<p><u>Biography</u> Create a biography about Winston Churchill. Talk about his early life, as well as his role as Prime Minister.</p>
Creative	<p><u>Aircraft</u> Design a WW2 Spitfire or Hurricane plane. If possible, make a model of your design using plasticine or clay.</p>	<p><u>Anderson shelter</u> Build a model of an Anderson shelter.</p>	<p><u>Bakery</u> Find a recipe for a popular dish from World War 2. Take photos of you making the dish and (if you can!) bring in a sample of the dish to show (and for your teacher to sample!!)</p>
RE	<p>Design a poster showing how by living out our school values, we can bring peace to our community</p>
